





Opportunities in Government Sector (UPSC/MPSC)


4th October 2024




DAY 1 : 8[™] JANUARY 2025




DAY 2: 9TH JANUARY 2025

SICKLE CELL AWARENESS SESSION




INTRODUCTION

Day 2: 17th January 2025


INTRODUCTION

Day 3: 18th January 2025


INTRODUCTION

ORGAN DONATION AWARENESS CAMPAIGN


